



AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION OPERATIONS ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

LACKAWANNA COLLEGE

AND

FAYETTE COUNTY CAREER & TECHNOLOGY INSTITUTE

PURPOSE:

This Articulation Agreement ("Agreement") is valid effective July 1, 2020.

Fayette County Career & Technology Institute ("FCCTI") and Lackawanna College ("LC") enter this Agreement, effective July 1, 2020, in order to facilitate the transfer of students from FCCTI to LC and to support their academic success in the LC Agribusiness Degree Program.

AREAS OF AGREEMENT:

This Agreement will be applicable for students who have completed the Agriculture (PDE CIP 01.0301 Agricultural Production Operations) Program. The student must meet all of the following requirements:

- Apply to and enroll at Lackawanna College (Lake Region Center) Agribusiness Associate in Science Degree Program the same year as high school graduation
- Obtain an overall GPA in Technical Core Courses of at least 2.5 out of 4.0, noted on transcript
- Obtain proficient on all tasks list on the CIP 01.0301 Task Grid, signed by Technical Course instructor
- Meet all LC Admissions requirements

This Agreement will not be applicable to students transferring without completing the Agribusiness Associate in Science Program.

Under terms of this Agreement, students completing the Agricultural Production Operations Program will be admitted to the Associate of Science Agribusiness Program at LC on the condition that they abide by this Agreement.

Students who have completed the Agricultural Production Operations Program would be granted credit for the following courses in the LC Agribusiness Associate in Science Program:

- ACC 105 – Principles of Accounting I (3 credits)*
- AGR 105 – Basic Farm Maintenance (3 credits)*
- AGR 200 – Agriculture Internship (6 credits)*
- AGR 220 – Organic Crop Production (3 credits)*
- AGR 225 – Farm Business Management (3 credits)*
- AGR 235 – Soil Science (3 credits)*
- HOR 110 – Plant Propagation (3 credits)*

LC reserves the right to accept/deny students into the Agribusiness Associate in Science Program.

CONDITIONS OF THE AGREEMENT

1. The LC Director of Admissions, LC Programs of Study Coordinator and Recruiter, and the Fayette County Career & Technology Institute Curriculum Director will monitor compliance with the terms of this Agreement.
2. Either institution may withdraw from this Agreement upon written notification directed to the other, except that commitments already in effect for students who have applied to LC will be honored. In the event of a substantial breach, such as, a lack of response to requests for information and a lack of adequate participation, either party may immediately terminate this Agreement.
3. The relationship of the parties to this Agreement shall not be construed to constitute a partnership, joint venture, or any other relationship, other than that of independent contractors.
4. Neither of the parties shall assume any liabilities as a result of this Agreement. As to liability to each other or death to persons, or damages to property, the parties do not waive any defense as a result of entering into this contract. Nothing herein shall be construed as a waiver of any immunities afforded by LC by law or otherwise.
5. This Agreement represents the entire understanding between the parties. This Agreement can be modified only in writing with the same formality as the original Agreement.
