

This agreement of articulation made and entered into this 24th day of October 2023,

By and between: **FAYETTE COUNTY CAREER & TECHNICAL INSTITUTE**

And

NEW CASTLE SCHOOL OF TRADES

Where, Fayette County Career & Technical Center (FCCTI) and the New Castle School of Trades (NCST) have agreed and wish this document to serve as a memorandum of their agreement concerning cooperation related to advanced standing credit for graduates of FCCTI that have successfully completed the **Vehicle Maintenance & Repair Technology Program** and wishing to pursue an occupational associate degree in Motorcycle & Power Equipment Technology at the New Castle School of Trades. To this end, the Administration of the New Castle School of Trades and the FCCTI hereby agree as follows:

1. The objective of this agreement is to assist graduates of FCCTI who wish to enroll in the Motorcycle & Power Equipment Technology Program at the New Castle School of Trades to increase their career potential and technical skills before entering the job market by receiving the opportunity for advanced standing credit in pursuit of an Associate Degree in Specialized Technology in their chosen career of powersports and small engine technician.
2. Graduates of the FCCTI successfully completing Vehicle Maintenance & Repair will receive credit for one quarter of training (15 credits/10 weeks) in the Motorcycle & Power Equipment Technology Program (90 credits/60 weeks) at NCST if the following conditions are met:
 - a. Applicants for advanced standing credit must meet the admission requirements of NCST and register as a student.
 - b. A high school transcript and request for advanced standing credit must be submitted to an Admissions Representative of NCST.
 - c. Application for advanced standing credit must be made within two years of graduation from FCCTI. When more than two years have elapsed, evaluation and acceptance of advanced standing credit shall be at the discretion of the appropriate NCST official.
 - d. The graduate of FCCTI must have graduated with a 3.0 (B) or higher overall grade point average.
